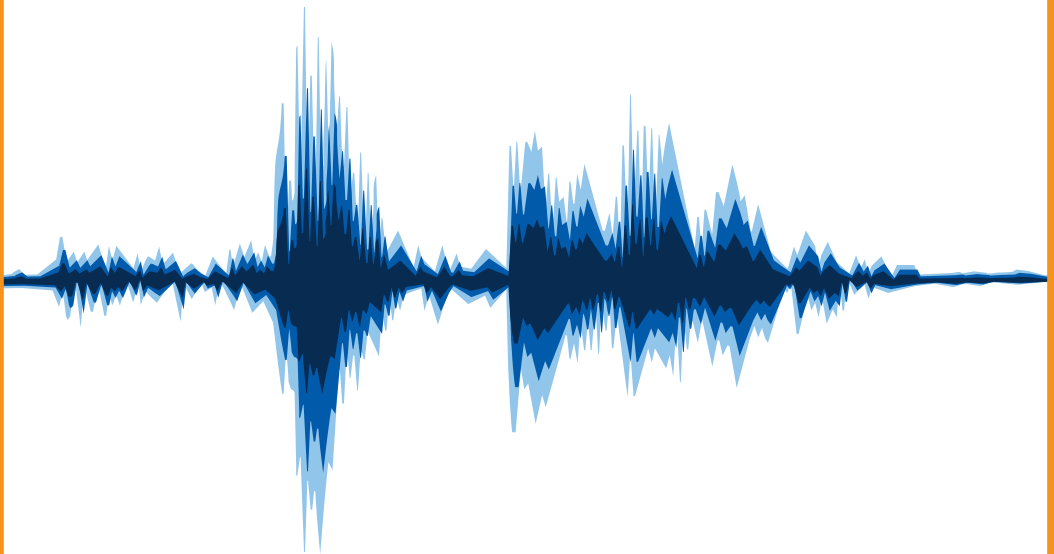
By plane

Basel-Mulhouse-Freiburg Airport (EuroAirport) is the nearest airport, just an hour's drive away. It offers international scheduled flights and charter flights.
